



Visitors To The House

For everyone's health and safety, public visits to Scott Manor House in the summer of 2021 will be in accordance with all public health protocols. COVID-19 measures are in place, nonetheless, visiting is **at your own risk**.

Visitors will be allowed to view exhibits and/or tour the House within a family/social group bubble to a maximum of 6 individuals at one time. The host will greet visitors as they arrive and the group will be allowed entrance for a maximum of 30 minutes, unless there is no one waiting to enter, and the bubble may be able to have a longer tour. All visitors must adhere to the following:

- All COVID-19 (coronavirus) precautions must be followed during your visit.
- Do not visit / stay at home: if you are feeling unwell or if you have symptoms of coronavirus or if you are required to self-isolate for any reason. Check the Nova Scotia government website for more information <https://novascotia.ca/coronavirus/>. Reasons for self-isolation include (at the time of writing; subject to change): you have been referred for COVID-19 testing by Public Health, a COVID-19 self-assessment or 811; you are waiting for your test results; you have tested positive for COVID-19; you have been told by Public Health you have been exposed and need to self-isolate, even if you have tested negative for COVID-19; you have travelled from outside Atlantic Canada into Nova Scotia, even if you don't have symptoms; or you are sharing any living spaces with someone who has travelled into Nova Scotia or returning to Nova Scotia from outside Atlantic Canada for non-essential travel.
- A representative of the Fort Sackville Foundation will guide you through your visit.
- You are required to provide your name, telephone number and if possible, your email address.
- You will be asked if you are unwell or if you are required to self-isolate. Entry will be refused if these conditions apply to you.
- Masks (nonmedical face coverings) **are** required at all times during your visit.
- Physical distancing must be practiced during the entire visit. Respect the distance markings, directional arrows and any health and safety instructions given by your host.
- Use hand sanitizer when you enter and leave the building.
- Do not touch the objects on display.
